Elizabeth Seton Children's is reimagining the health care landscape. With its groundbreaking new young adult center – the first of its kind in the nation – Elizabeth Seton Children's will transform the futures of young adults living with severe medical complexities for generations to come. Here they will receive an unparalleled quality of care that is tailored to their specific medical and emotional needs and unmatched anywhere else in the world.

Our young adult center will be a lifetime home for 72 residents that is fully equipped with the things that make this home unique and state-of-the-art. With highly specialized, 24/7 care and the most advanced medical technologies available, it will serve as a nationwide model for caring for the complex medical conditions of young adults.

For many young people with severe medical complexity and their families, the formative transition from childhood to young adulthood is all the more precious after years of overcoming unimaginable medical hurdles.

The Elizabeth Seton Young Adult Center will be a haven for so many – a place where these extraordinary individuals can truly flourish and experience the fullness of life.

GROWING TO MEET THE NEED

The Aging Out Crisis

Until recently, children with medical complexities rarely lived beyond the age of 21. Fortunately, medical and technological advancements are allowing these children to live longer and healthier lives.

For most of our young adult residents at Elizabeth Seton Children's Center, aging out means having to be transferred to a geriatric nursing facility that is not equipped to handle their specialty medical, social or emotional needs.

THIS IS UNACCEPTABLE.

Our young adults have tremendous determination and spirit. They deserve to live in an age-appropriate environment filled with love where they can safely become adults.

We are uniquely prepared to respond to the aging out crisis. Elizabeth Seton Children's has already successfully completed two major construction projects within the past 10 years both within budget and on time. We have the leadership, experience and track record to successfully pioneer this groundbreaking project.



A POPULATION ON THE RISE

In New York State, there are an estimated 5,500 children with high-need medical complexity under the age of 21 enrolled in Medicaid.

Our health care system has not caught up to meet the needs of this growing population. The Elizabeth Seton Young Adult Center aims to change that. By 2023, 50 residents of the children's center will move into this new home.

THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON OUR CHILDREN

The Time to Act is Now

The COVID-19 pandemic poses an additional threat to the children and young adults who reside at Elizabeth Seton Children’s Center. With complex health conditions and compromised respiratory systems (62 percent have tracheostomies and 46 percent require ventilator support), our residents are always the most vulnerable of society.

During this crisis, because of extensive planning, preparedness and safety protocols, as well as strong leadership and a culture committed to excellence, the children’s center has been remarkably successful at keeping its residents safe. In fact, all residents remained COVID-free for 300 consecutive days: the Elizabeth Seton Children’s miracle of 2020.

And now, the children’s center’s greatest defense against the virus is the COVID-19 vaccine. As of May 2021, 79 percent of eligible residents ages 12 and older have been vaccinated with parent/guardian consent, along with approximately 68 percent of children’s center staff.

However, soon Max must leave the place he calls home.

Max is now 18 and, within a few years, he will reach 21 – the age at which pediatric nursing home placement ends and most young adults with complex medical needs transfer to a geriatric nursing home.
