

At Elizabeth Seton Children's Rehabilitation Center, witnessing a child who uses a wheelchair stand to kick a soccer ball for the very first time or celebrating a child who can now enjoy a meal around the dinner table after receiving feeding therapy are blessed moments. Advancing Rehabilitation Through Philanthropy

After granting a C-MILL VR+ treadmill in 2022, **The Alfred E. Smith Memorial Foundation** contributed a second, unprecedented \$150,000 gift to modernize our rehabilitation center in 2024. Their generosity funded new equipment for the therapy gym, speech therapy program and hydrotherapy pool and also supported infrastructure changes to meet the increased demands of this high-powered technology.

A \$125,000 gift from the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation allowed us to purchase advanced gait-training equipment to help younger children increase their mobility. This provides opportunities for hands-free and self-determined walking, which steadily moves our patients toward a brighter, more independent future.

Ongoing support from the **Sisters of Charity** continued to fund VitalStim, a breakthrough neuromuscular electrical stimulation device that makes it possible for those with severe swallowing difficulties to eat. We now have three VitalStim units and six speech and language pathologists who use them daily in therapy.



A PORTRAIT OF PERSEVERANCE: ANTHONY'S STORY

Seventeen-year-old Anthony is a spirited teenager who loves his family, sports and laughing with friends. Today, he's preparing his college applications and looking forward to giving back by volunteering at our rehabilitation center that has been so formative to his life.

Diagnosed with epilepsy as an infant, Anthony experienced a post-surgical infection at 18 months that resulted in extreme loss of movement. To help Anthony reach his greatest potential, his parents enrolled him in Elizabeth Seton Children's School where he attended full-day preschool and received therapy at our adjoining rehabilitation center.

Over the course of many years, and with the use of the latest technology and equipment, Anthony has increased his range of motion, strengthened his body and built his confidence. His mother, Claudia Pastore, believes that early access to the expert care provided by our team, coupled with Anthony's grit and determination, have allowed her son to make remarkable strides and truly discover himself.

As he looks to the future, Anthony is not only sketching his dreams as an aspiring illustrator, he's drawing inspiration from the care and compassion that helped him thrive.

2024 DONOR IMPACT REPORT

A Global First for Young Adults

Thanks to incredible advances in medicine, technology and quality services, more teens and young adults with profound medical conditions are living longer, healthier lives. However, for the parents of the children we serve, their child's 21st birthday is a milestone filled with angst because, at this crossroads, these young people age out of pediatric care.

What awaits them at 21 too often is a broken system: nursing homes meant for the elderly or institutions that simply cannot meet their needs. The results are heartbreaking: diminished care, a decline in quality of life and, even more tragically, untimely deaths.



Currently, more than 50 Elizabeth Seton Children's Center residents are over age 21. Our \$156 million, five-story, 96-bed center will provide exceptional, 24-hour skilled nursing, respiratory and medical services, rehabilitation therapies, palliative care, therapeutic recreation, social work, spiritual care, nutrition, on-site specialty clinics and more.

This haven will ensure that turning 21 is no longer a moment of fear and uncertainty. Instead, it will signal a new chapter of hope and possibilities – where young people can continue to grow and families can find lasting peace of mind knowing their children will always have a place where they belong at Elizabeth Seton Children's.

Breaking New Ground

In 2024, we took meaningful steps to bring the young adult center to fruition.

This progress culminated with the momentous financing and groundbreaking of this new home in August 2025. Thanks to you, our magnanimous donors, along with the staunch support of our elected officials, regulators and community partners, our dreams are coming true.

While we have made great progress, we still need to raise \$18 million to operationalize. We ask that you please join us in this urgent and final phase.

Together, we can bridge the gap and bring this pioneering center to life.

When we open the doors in early 2028, our young adults will experience unparalleled care and vibrant programming.

This trailblazing center will carry forward the love and clinical excellence that are the hallmarks of Elizabeth Seton Children's – creating a seamless path on the journey from childhood into adulthood and ensuring our residents continue to receive the specialized support they have always known and deserve.



"BELLA NOTTE" 2024: GOING THE DISTANCE

"Go the Distance" was more than a theme at our annual "Bella Notte" gala; it was a powerful reflection of our community's determination to create our young adult center.

One of the evening's most heartfelt moments came when Ms. Lane, the mother of children's center resident, Sha'de, shared how her family's faith and trust in God gave her the strength and resilience to lift up.

Sha'de is 24 years old and has lived at the children's center since 2016 after suffering a traumatic brain injury. With courage and grace, Ms. Lane expressed deep appreciation that her daughter receives the highest quality care and opportunities to experience the fullness of life every day with loving caregivers who have become family.

For years, Ms. Lane said she worried what the future would hold when her daughter aged out.


That question, she affirmed, finally has a solution and her prayers have been answered.
